

## **Narrative Essay Format**

A **narrative essay** tells a story from the writer's perspective while conveying a meaningful lesson, insight, or experience. Unlike argumentative or analytical essays, it follows a chronological sequence of events and uses descriptive details to engage readers.

### **1. Introduction**

- Hook to grab the reader's attention
- Brief background or setting
- Thesis statement or central theme of the story

#### **Example Structure:**

Hook → Setting/Context → Main Lesson or Theme

### **2. Body Paragraph 1: Beginning of the Story**

- Introduce characters, setting, and situation
- Explain what led to the main event

#### **Focus:**

Who? What? When? Where?

### **3. Body Paragraph 2: Rising Action**

- Describe events leading to the climax
  - Build tension, conflict, or anticipation
  - Use vivid sensory details and dialogue when appropriate
- 

### **4. Body Paragraph 3: Climax**

- Present the most important or dramatic moment
  - Show how the narrator responded to the situation
- 

### **5. Body Paragraph 4: Falling Action and Resolution**

- Explain what happened after the climax
- Describe how the conflict was resolved

- Reflect on the experience
- 

## **6. Conclusion**

- Summarize the lesson learned or insight gained
  - Explain the significance of the experience
  - End with a memorable final thought
-

- Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt

- Spacing: Double-spaced
- Margins: 1 inch on all sides
- Alignment: Left-aligned
- Paragraphs: Indent the first line by 0.5 inches
- Point of View: Usually first person ("I," "me," "my")
- Writing Style: Descriptive, engaging, and chronological
