Social influence research consistently demonstrates that ordinary people will comply with authority figures even when doing so conflicts with their personal moral values. Milgram's (1963) obedience studies found that 65% of participants administered what they believed were dangerous electric shocks when instructed by an experimenter — a finding that challenged the widespread assumption that harmful obedience was a product of individual pathology rather than situational pressure. This essay argues that conformity and obedience are best understood not as character flaws but as predictable responses to social structure and that Milgram's findings remain the most compelling evidence for this position despite well-documented methodological criticisms.
