Diligence and intelligence are the two key features that help to safeguard against failure. I had this realization during the early times of my academic career. Initially, I had put my entire trust in institutions, advisors, and the educational system without any question. This allowed me to assume that my efforts would always be met with legitimacy. However, during this year I faced a major academic setback, which was unexpected in nature. This setback allowed me to think that the belief I had was not accurate and that intelligence must be accompanied by my own judgment.

That experience forced me to examine how decisions are made within complex systems and how easily assumptions can replace verification. Rather than retreat, I learned to slow down, ask better questions, and confirm information independently. I became more deliberate, not only in academics, but in every professional environment I entered afterward.

This growth reshaped how I function in clinical settings. As a medical assistant, I no longer accept information at face value; I verify orders, clarify discrepancies, and advocate respectfully when something does not align with patient safety. I have learned that thoughtful medicine depends not on unquestioned authority, but on collaborative accountability.

Resilience, for me, is no longer defined as endurance alone. It is the ability to refine judgment, apply lessons forward, and make safer decisions the next time. Duke's emphasis on analytical thinking and team-based care reflects the clinician I have become—one who values vigilance, humility, and responsibility in service of patients.
